Ottawa artist Shirley Van Dusen is internationally recognized for both her sensitively rendered portraits and her evocative paintings of iconic scenes of Ottawa and the surrounding valley. Her paintings of Ottawa's Parliament Hill, the Canadian Tulip Festival, Prime Ministers and everyday folk are held in notable private and public




collections around the world including Prime Ministers Pierre Elliot Trudeau (1919-2000) and Brian Mulroney, the National Press Clubs in Ottawa and Washington, DC and the Bank of Canada. In his newest series "Far and Wide", Richard Ahnert further explores the Canadiana narrative. The body of work continues to invoke the nostalgic romanticism of the wildlife and people that make this vast land home.

The show draws heavily on Canadian iconography and nature symbolism. Like in most of Ahnert's work, animals are shown as oddly displaced from their habitats and realities. Voluntary or forced, their departure preludes a new social order, one that is marked by the inevitable displacement and subdual of animal life via humans.

This series poignantly emphasizes the sanctity of our precious Canadian land and its inhabitants, while also alluding to the harsh realities that inevitably follow from human intervention. The work not only celebrates our glorious heritage and the beauty of the Canadian landscape, but often reminds us of our own folly.

A New Direction in Art Materials



**Coming soon to Ottawa!** Wallace Seymour, a new exciting and innovative art materials manufacturer from England have created unique ranges of oil, acrylic, watercolour (tube and pan), gouache, hand-made soft pastel, hand-made drawing materials, primers and painting mediums.

**Chris Tinkler**, owner of **Select Fine Art Materials** will be organizing several presentations (full day sessions) with product demonstrations and information to take place during the last two weeks of October and first two weeks of November.

Wallace Seymour art materials are an extremely important development in the industry, largely due to their re-evaluation of the industry approach to art materials. The approach that they take is historical in nature and re-contextualizes our current accepted practices. Wallace Seymour is putting the art back into art materials through that historical lens.

Select Fine Art Materials is looking for participants and would like to have groups of at least 25 people. So far we have a presentations happening in Toronto and Montreal. I would like to have about three in Ottawa.

These are expected to be during the **last two weeks of October and the first two weeks of November** (dates to follow).

Rebecca Wallace and Pip Seymour formed the company Pip Seymour Fine Art Products in 2011. Wallace Seymour began to create a programme of high quality painting and drawing materials, made under their control and with their shared vision to provide artists with the maximum potential for expression through colour.

To this end Wallace Seymour have created unique ranges of; oil, acrylic, watercolour (tube and pan), gouache, hand-made soft pastel, hand-made drawing materials, primers and painting mediums. They looked at long forgotten colours, alongside ancient and modern pigments to create colour palettes to suit the needs of the most progressive and challenging artists.

Their production benefits from over twenty years of experience within the art materials industry and the knowledge gained through this and through their practice as artists. In addition to their paint ranges, they have introduced a comprehensive selection of dry pigments, many of which are sourced from original quarries and processed within their own production.

Guest Speaker Joyce Westrop September 12, 2017 7 – 9 pm

Where do we find new ideas? And how to keep them going? Joyce Westrop will share her process through an artist talk with slide show.

I tend to revisit the same themes and motifs over the years, but with a lot of experimenting with materials and methods. I use the images and ideas as a springboard for open-ended exploration. I start with one foot in the real world, but using abstraction I stray away from reality, and can introduce humour, absurdity and/or tension so that the unexpected can happen. Join me for an informal evening of art and ideas, with plenty of opportunity to ask questions.

Joyce Westrop is a contemporary artist working in Ottawa, Canada. She examines the world through drawing, printmaking, photography and sculpture.

At the University of Ottawa, Joyce Westrop majored in drawing and sculpture, she participated in various exhibitions and received awards for creative achievement. After graduating with a BFA in 2001 (magna cum laude), Westrop studied printmaking at the Ottawa School of Art. She exhibits extensively. Westrop's work is in many collections, including the Art Bank of Canada (2009) and the City of Ottawa (2012). She has received grants for her work from the City of Ottawa (type B in 2003) and Ontario Arts Council (emerging artist in 2005 & 2013).

Currently Westrop is a member of the Enriched Bread Artists collective (EBA) and represented by Gallery 3.
