The City of Coaticook, traditionally known as "the Pearl of the Eastern Townships", invites professional visual artists. Located in south-eastern Quebec, this charming little town is anchored on both banks of the river bearing his name. An hour and fifteen minute drive separates Coaticook from the city of Montreal.

For several years, the City of Coaticook has implemented the program "Artist in Residence" allowing multiple artists to have free access to a well-equipped workshop with a small housing. The enchanting sights of the city and surrounding countryside seem to be the perfect environment to stimulate inspiration and creativity. Situated in the heart of mixed forests that characterize the region of the Appalachian mountains, our valleys, rivers, lakes and woodland can enhance the creative instinct. 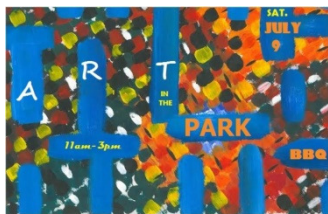

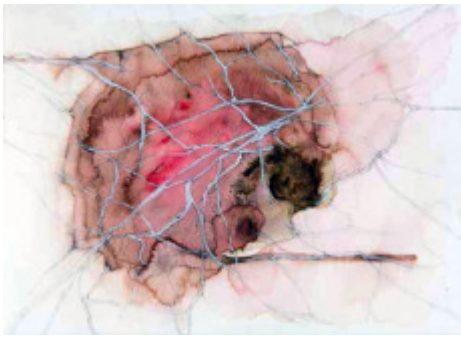

This exhibition features conceptual works that reflect artist Gail Bourgeois’ engagement with the Firestone Collection of Canadian Art. Drawings that depict overlapping lines and nodes, done in ink wash, wax crayon, graphite and watercolour, are installed to correspond with objects cast from consumer packaging, demonstrating the scope of the artist’s creative process. The works are simultaneously organic and architectural, delicate and bold, and reveal Bourgeois’ sophisticated understanding of composition.
